CORE Continuum

This 2 weekend (4 day) course will provide a framework for the treatment of the more complex interdisciplinary dental patient. The first step in the process is the diagnosis, followed by the treatment plan. The next step is the coordination and sequencing of the treatment plan with the specialists. The final step is the provision of the restorative dentistry. It is the purpose of the course to provide a step-by-step system to allow the restorative dentist to complete each step in the process.

The purpose of this continuum is to provide common language for the Restorative Dentist, Orthodontist, Periodontist, and the Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeon so you may successfully treat the most complex of patients.

Global Diagnosis – There are 4 Global Diagnoses which dictate all interdisciplinary treatment planning. We will discuss these 4 diagnoses, and describe the primary treatment options for each. We will then learn the "5 Questions" which lead us through the diagnostic system. Finally, we will use case studies to illustrate the process from diagnosis to completion.

DAY 2

The 6 Tools – "Putting the Teeth in the Middle of the Smile" – Once the Global Diagnosis is complete, the interdisciplinary team only has 6 treatment options to place the hard and soft tissues into the correct positions. These treatment options will be illustrated with many case presentations.

WEEKEND 2 NOVEMBER 13-14, 2015

DAY 1

Dentoalveolar Extrusion – The Most Difficult Patient in Dentistry – Dentoalveolar Extrusion is the Global Diagnosis that is commonly the most difficult for the restorative dentist to treat. There are 3 primary treatment options and 6 additional treatment options in more specialized situations. There will be an in depth discussion of the planning and treatment of the patient requiring a full mouth rehabilitation with an emphasis on increasing vertical dimension.

DAY 2

Porcelain Veneers – The 21st Century Solution for Anterior Porcelain – It is clear that the primary porcelain restoration in the anterior region is the porcelain veneer, not the full crown. WE will discuss all aspects of the porcelain veneer including, materials, preparation, insertion, maintenance and modes of failure. The final afternoon will be treatment planning session to bring theory into reality.
